
are also able to share news via our on-line Members Hub and e-bulletin.





Rebecca Fielding, Employment Partner at Square One Law guides us through the key steps to build a strong company culture to add to a business' brand identity...



Competition for talent is a key factor for business growth and businesses are having to work harder than ever to attract great candidates. Successful businesses understand that one of the main factors that will influence a candidate is their reputation as an employer and they also recognise that their internal branding, (their vision, culture and values) is just as important as their external brand.

This begs the question, why do so few companies have an employer branding strateay?

Those that understand the potential of developing an employer brand recognise the huge opportunity for Marketing and HR leaders to collaborate on this critical issue. It makes sense seeing as both areas are focussed not only on influencing and motivating people, but also on influencing business behaviours and strategy.

Marketing professionals have access to the latest technological trends to communicate and engage with their customers, but these tools can also be

utilised to help attract and retain talen By working alongside HR they have the opportunity to better understand employee engagement, behaviours and challenges.

A strong company culture adds to a business' brand identity and helps attract talent and, more importantly retain talent.

company's core values in action. The ways in which you conduct business, manage workflow, interact as a team, treat your customers and your people, all add up to an experience that should represent who you are as a company.

A brand is built up of 5 key areas:

- 1. **Vision** | What's our purpose? Where are we going? What are the aspirations of the business?
- 2. **Values** | They are the DNA of any business. What we are about and what type of culture and behaviours do we want?
- 3. **Services** | The products or services we offer to our customers and the type of service delivery our brand will represent.
- 4. **Processes** | Strong brands are built on the quality, efficiency and effectiveness of your processes. You need to be able to deliver what you promise.
- 5. **People** | A strong internal brand is all about your people and excellent employee engagement.

The senior management team need to be strong advocates of the culture and lead by example. Part of their role is to communicate what is the core purpose of the business. Everyone in the business needs to understand what it is you do, why you do it and also understand the roles and responsibilities of the different teams within the business and the value they bring.

Working collaboratively, Marketing can produce a communication strategy that helps position the internal brand and gain commitment, whilst HR can organise internal workshops that explore how the culture brings people together within the company and keeps them aligned. By involving your people, you give them a voice and help bring your brand to life.

When your culture is clear, different perspectives can gather behind it with common purpose. The culture at your organisation sets expectations for how people behave and work together, and how well they function as a team.

Culture can break down the boundaries between siloed teams, guide decision-making, and improve productivity, however a toxic organisational culture has the capacity to do just the opposite.

If the behaviours of cynics and saboteurs within the business are tolerated and undermine core values, then they will undoubtedly damage your employer brand and your values are at risk of just becoming meaningless buzz words. If a senior person in the company is behaving in this manner, then it completely undermines the hard work being done to build the internal brand. These behaviours need to be tackled head on as soon as they are identified in order to avoid them becoming a systemic problem within the organisation.

Cultural fit is now becoming increasingly important for businesses and recent reports show that organisational culture has a direct impact on performance and, more importantly, your employees' wellbeing. A healthy culture addresses both of these areas by finding an appropriate balance based on company values.

In conclusion, employer branding can be successfully developed by Marketing and HR working collaboratively together, serving to ensure that your business is ahead of the pack when it comes to attracting and retaining the best talent.



the regulation and demonstrate local supply chain solutions.

In May 2019 we turned our focus to planning and managing turnarounds, capital and revenue projects in the complex and demanding process plant environment.

If projects and turnarounds are not properly planned, managed and controlled, companies run the risk of safety issues, serious budget overruns, costly schedule delays and negative impacts on customers.

During this new event for 2019, we explored project and turnaround best practice, demonstrated how to develop a strategy that mitigates the risks, investigated the management process from concept through to commissioning and highlighted local capabilities and solutions.

GSK also delivered a presentation on a predictive HVAC commission system that had been inspired by their collaboration with the F1 company McLaren proving that best practice sharing extends into other key sectors present in our region.

Further best practice visits will be held in the near future to harness the spirit of cooperation that exists between our manufacturing members.

2019 will also see the return of the highly successful Best Practice in Industrial Asset Management conference.

TEN STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL TPM PROGRAMME

One thing is clear when you visit a high performing, mature manufacturing environment - there exists an unwavering focus on keeping the product flowing across the various processes, systems and machines.

Mature manufacturers place asset reliability as one of the central pillars within their manufacturing system as they know that this will ensure the product leaves the factory on time and in full and at the best possible price.

The process industry is becoming progressively dependent on the reliability and predictability of fewer more sophisticated machines and processes, meaning our focus and attention is placed on equipment operating performance. The overall effectiveness of our machines, equipment and processes is necessary to ensure the consistency of product quality and supply at a realistic and competitive price.

Manufacturers are also now managing the impact of the emerging technologies that form part of the 4th Industrial Revolution. This technology which provides better visibility and connectivity with both our customers and the wider operational system will impact how we manufacture, and how we work.

Over 30 years ago a number of 'world class' companies recognised that the effective application of modern technology can only be achieved through people, starting with the operators and maintainers of that applied technology, and not through systems alone. Hence the emergence of Total Productive Maintenance as the enabling tool to maximise the effectiveness of their equipment by setting and maintaining the optimum relationship between people and their machines.

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The problem with the traditional definitions of PM is that it implies the maintenance function sits outside of the manufacturing function, but it doesn't and can't. TPM is a fundamental system within Manufacturing & Operations. It is no longer appropriate to say 'I operate, you fix' and 'I add value, you cost money'.

FEATURE | BEST PRACTICE

What an effective TPM system promotes and can deliver in the right hands is a mind-set that says 'We are both responsible for this machine, process or equipment asset and, between us, we will determine the best way of operating and maintaining this asset in the firm belief that if you ask our opinion about that 'best way' and then incorporate it in our future ways of working, then we will stick with it because it's our ideal

In our new book **TPM: The Foundation of Operational Excellence** we argue that there is a better way of describing TPM and that is to consider it to be Total Productive Manufacturing. By making this simple descriptive change we hope to change mindsets and encourage those deploying TPM to focus on: ownership by all within the manufacturing process, team-work and culture-change. Changing behaviours will have a powerful impact on the sustainability of the TPM programme as well as its effectiveness.

The new TPM book outlines the 11 Step model which was developed by the S A Partners and sets out a proven methodology for delivering an excellent TPM programme.

The steps are:

- 1. Review performance criteria and history
- 2. Measurement & opportunity analysis of KPI's (incl. OEE)
- 3. Assess hidden losses, wastes and set improvement priorities
- 4. Equipment criticality assessment
- 5. Condition appraisal and restoration plan
- 6. Develop future total asset care
- 7. Root cause analysis & problem resolution
- 8. Best practice & standard work
- 9. Individual & team skill development
- 10. Leadership & behaviours
- 11. Audit & review process

Through the case studies within TPM: A Foundation for Operational Excellence we observed that companies that not only successfully deployed TPM but also sustained the improvement demonstrated a number of further mind-sets which were:

- ·They enrolled and secured the visible and consistent commitment of the corporate and site leadership team.
- ·TPM was seen to be led by manufacturing as a key enabler to deliver the company's continuous improvement and operational excellence programme.
- \cdot They achieved operational excellence aspirations as they had the operational basics in place.
- ·TPM was regarded as a practical and hands-on empowerment process which gave shared responsibility and ownership to all employees.

TPM should be a foundational system of work within your operational excellence programme in the sense that it is a practical application of team working which allows you to take the company's vision and values and say with conviction:

"Here you are then, TPM will allow you to make a difference, leading to a trouble-free shift by working smarter, not harder"

Offshore wind is a UK success story, already generating enough green energy to power around 7 million UK homes, directly employing 7,200 people in skilled careers and representing 20% of all current UK infrastructure investment.

This news is particularly relevant for the North East, which has already established a strong and diverse cluster of smart and collaborative supply chain companies due in part to its solid industrial heritage. Key to the deal is encouraging new entrants to the sector and providing opportunities to those already participating to maximise their potential.

innogy, one of the UK's leading energy companies, is establishing an important regional presence in the North East, with two major offshore wind farms underway. It is here that the organisation plans to deliver some of the key components of the Sector Deal and anticipates further opportunities for growth in years to come.

The 857-megawatt (MW) Triton Knoll Offshore Wind Farm, now under construction in Lincolnshire, has already become a catalyst for new investment at its construction base in Seaton Port, Teesside.

Triton Knoll will be followed in the region by the 1.4GW Sofia Offshore Wind Farm, sited 165 kilometres off the UK coast on Dogger Bank and with an agreed connection point in Lackenby, Teesside.

Sofia represents a total anticipated investment of between £3 and 4 billion and will offer further significant economic opportunities for the North East. Once operational, it would generate enough green energy each year to meet the needs of more than 1 million UK households.

Sofia Offshore Wind Farm is now preparing to bid in the government's 2019 Contracts for Difference (CfD) auction. The government has committed to run auctions approximately every two years, giving the offshore industry long-term pipeline visibility, and

with the expectation of an increased investment in the UK supply chain.

Assuming a successful outcome in the CfD auction, contracts will be awarded for Sofia throughout the development, construction and operational phases of the project however, the majority of key contracts will come into effect with the final investment decision, anticipated for 2020. These contracts will be for a full range of works including onshore enabling and grid connection activities, turbine and balance of plant supply, offshore installation and commissioning, operations & maintenance and support services.

innogy is committed to the successful completion of Triton Knoll, to delivering a winning bid for Sofia and to maximising the supply chain benefits for the North East and wider UK. In support of this aim, the organisation has launched registration portals for companies to submit their interest in supply chain opportunities.

The UK offshore wind industry has proven it can deliver clean energy, quickly and on budget, but it can also deliver economic benefits both here in the UK, and globally via export of knowledge, expertise and skills. In the North East innogy, though its Triton Knoll and Sofia projects, is working hard to utilise the region's capabilities and support real economic growth while also providing a reliable, cost-effective green energy resource.




